



City & Hackney Health & Social Care Forum Transformation Update

5th June 2017

City & Health & Social Care Forum are going to start doing regular updates in this newsletter as there are many changes to the health & social care system being discussed that will affect us all as organisations and as residents.

We previously published [this](#) guide to transformation structure which gives an overview of the governance for transformation.

Hackney Integrated Commissioning Board

The Hackney Integrated Commissioning Board (ICB) met for the first time last week, with Jake Ferguson representing the voluntary sector until we have a rep in place. As this was their first meeting, the Terms of Reference were accepted, and there was a lot of discussion around the legalities of sharing funding. There is also a new concept being discussed called Accountable Care Systems: The NHS England's *Five Year Forward View* delivery plan has said that hospital trusts, CCGs and local authorities in the new ACSs will 'take on clear collective responsibility for resources and population health' City & Hackney will be one Accountable Care System (ACS), of three across North East London STP area.

There is an upcoming workshop on Accountable Care Systems that the reps will be attending, and we will be asking for public consultation around the concepts involved.

Workstreams

Three of the four workstreams have outlined their priorities for 2017/18 - **Unplanned Care, Planned Care and Prevention** (the Young People and Early Years workstream will likely not be in place until early 2018). These priorities are currently very heavily skewed towards clinical concern and, as such, we at Hackney CVS will be meeting workstream leads (SROs) to discuss the excellent work already happening in the voluntary and community sector in these areas, and we will have Voluntary & Community Sector representatives on each workstream to represent the wider sector.

Jake raised a concern about the clinical nature of the priorities as the [Marmot Principles](#) are integral to a wider conversation around health and deprivation, and as a result it was decided that these will be picked up by the Health and Wellbeing Board.

Enhanced Primary Care

The Enhanced Primary Care (EPC) Steering Group also had their first meeting last week. EPC is an extremely large piece of work that eventually will span all four workstreams, and in which the Voluntary and Community Sector will be playing a significant role. Although it's early days, we envision that there will be further roles for reps to place as this workstream is broken down further into smaller pieces of work, especially around the as yet un-named person centred model of integrated community care begins to take shape.

We have had 8 applications for the representative positions we advertised and by the [HSCF Forum](#) on the 15th June we should be able to introduce you to the Integrated Commissioning Board Representative and the Transformation Board representative who will be selected after interview with HSCF steering group members.
